Cllr Kerrison advised that the refurbishment of the exterior of the B.T. Information Box has been completed; a contractor has been appointed to refurbish the village sign but there were no updates to report at this time.

Cllr Kerrison noted the sad passing of Mr N Fiske since last years meeting.

7) Reports from Representatives of Village Clubs and Groups

Cllr S Main presented an update on the local energy infrastructure development schemes. The construction of the EDF solar farm development is near completion and is expected to be connected Autumn 2025.

Enso, having secured their site for development with the aid of Government subsidies, have sold it on to Verdant. It is unknown if Enso have been required to repay any of the monies received from the Government. The Verdant community liaison group had met but with no satisfactory progress being achieved; there was poor/ no representation from the local planning authority nor the company in charge.

The Clearstone battery storage proposal has been granted permission by Mid Suffolk District Council; the vote was 5 to 3 in favour. Cllr Petersen attended the Planning Meeting where at he raised serious concerns regarding the expected noise levels from the site, when fully commissioned; Cllr Main had raised concerns regarding the de-commissioning timescales granted and how they varied from those
